A child is young only once and only for a short time. So much depends on the training you provide. This poem by an unknown author expresses it well.


The Sculptor

The philosophy of choice stands in direct contrast to the philosophy of indoctrination. The philosophy of choice is the acceptance of the belief that there are no

_____ values or beliefs. All values and beliefs are ______ and

thus, should be left to individual ______ and not be ______ on the next generation. Truth and error, right and wrong, good and evil are all relative. There are no absolutes.

Thus, homosexuality may be good or bad; the choice is yours. And you certainly shouldn't force your opinion on anyone else. Abortion may be good or bad; the choice is yours. But don't force your values on others. Let each individual make his own choice (cf. *Judges 21:25*). Sexual violence in song lyrics, explicit pictures and any other perversions that you would care to name are not subject to absolutes; they are subject to each individual's determination.

The philosophy of choice is not new. Its first advocate was _____; its first

victim was ______. God *indoctrinated* Adam and Eve with only the good; Satan's strategy was to *expose* them to both good and evil and let them make the choice.

The philosophy of choice found renewed life in the 1960s. It was called the

______. Sex outside of marriage was no longer right or wrong; it became an individual's choice. Drug use was neither right nor wrong, it was an individual's choice. And remember: you must not impose your choices upon others.

Many parents practice the philosophy of choice. They would advise you: "Expose your children to good and evil and hope they will choose good (if there is such a thing). Don't force them. Don't make moral choices for them."

Which philosophy do you believe dominates our culture today? The philosophy of choice has left our children's character bankrupt. The failure of the philosophy of choice has gutted the integrity of our nation. In many nations you can burn the flag, desecrate the national anthem, spend tax income to promote pornography in the name of art and murder innocent children by the tens of millions via abortions — all in the name of freedom of choice.
